Some Places of Interest in North East Somerset



Glastonbury Tor - Prominent hill overlooking the Isle of Avalon, Glastonbury and Somerset. Topped by the roofless St Michael's Tower, it is linked to Celtic mythology, especially to King Arthur.

City of Bath - Historic, beautiful and vibrant, the World Heritage City of Bath, uniquely represents 2000 years of history; Roman, Georgian and the Modern.



Tynesfield, National Trust - An ornate Victorian Gothic Revival house, with extensive gardens and parkland.



Wells Cathedral

City of Wells - A small Cathedral City on the southern edge of the Mendip Hills, noted for its inspiring 'most beautiful and most poetic of English Cathedrals'.



Bishop's Palace

Bishop's Palace - Home of Bishops of Bath and Wells for over 800 years, this stunning medieval palace is open for all to enjoy. There are 14 acres of award-winning gardens as well as its famous 'bell-ringing' swans.



Prior Park, National Trust - 18th Century landscaped Garden, designed by poet Alexander Pope and the landscape gardener Capability Brown. It has one of only 4 Palladian bridges in the world, as well as stunning views over Bath.



Frome - A picturesque town, perfect for a day trip, Frome boasts medieval streets lined with independent stores and a thriving arts scene.



A little further afield - **The Fleet Air Arm Museum, Yeovilton** - Extensive and impressive collection of military and civilian aircraft, including Concorde.
